You will need a DBS when working in H&Sc setting.

A DBS check is a record of a person's criminal convictions and cautions – carried out by the Disclosure and Barring Service.

It is an essential requirement for those applying to work with children or vulnerable adults (e.g. in teaching or healthcare) – and the information shown is used to ascertain a candidate's suitability for a role.
