



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CURRICULUM



SENIOR MATHS CHALLENGE

Each year our eager mathematicians take part in the UK Senior Maths Challenge. This year we've had just over 100 students enter for the competition. Students who do particularly well will then advance onto the Kangaroo stage later in the academic year.

This year we achieved one gold (Uzair Ali), ten silver and twenty-four bronze awards. Eleven of these students will then enter the next stage (Kangaroo competition), a real achievement for our students.

BIOLOGY OLYMPIAD

Students will have the unique opportunity to learn about and carry out a range of ecological sampling methods relevant to the A level Biology course. Preston Montford is a dedicated field studies centre with expert teachers allowing students to experience the highest standard of teaching and learning in this area.

With only 20 iBO Gold-award winning students selected for the course, Tawhid and Ashton are among only a handful of students in the country to attend this course. As such, attending the course will enhance the chance for both students to make successful applications to competitive universities.

Preston Montford has been awarded the Quality Badge by the Council for Learning Outside the Classroom for school groups. Each Centre achieved the badge by demonstrating that they consistently deliver high quality teaching and learning experiences to school groups and manage risk effectively.

Congratulations to two Biology students: Tawhid Mir and Ashton Lambert who achieved Gold Medals in the Biology Olympiad and have been selected to attend a Field Studies Council residential course in half-term. Thank-you to Jonathan Dalla-Riva for making this opportunity possible for the students.





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
